The Orchid Tree [AKA Purple Orchid Tree, Mountain Ebony, Poor Man's Orchid, Butterfly Tree] of the family Fabaceae/Leguminosae, botanical names: Bauhinia Variegata or Bauhinia Purpurea, is listed by the Floria Exotic Pest Plant Council as a Category I invasive species.

There are several planted in Park Trace Estates. As of June 1, 2015, however, NO NEW OR REPLACEMENT Orchid trees will be permitted to be planted.
